5. Please include some pictures, preferably as digital images, or tell us who we should contact to ask for pictures. The larger and more detailed the image, the better it will look when it is printed.
6. Please use Verdana 11 point for the text of the article. Generally, we publish articles that range from a half page to a page using this font.

- LCI will display Multiple District-level entries at the annual Lions International Convention, Registered convention attendees will vote for their favorite photos. LIONS HEALTH SCREENING UNIT—

The Yakima-West Valley and Tieton Lions have hosted the LHSU in their respective communities and school districts for ten days of school screenings during October. A public screening is also scheduled for October 22nd. School students are screened for vision & hearing. Vision, Hearing, Blood Pressure, Diabetes and Glaucoma tests are done during public screenings.

Lions attending the Fall Annual Convention had the opportunity to tour the new Lions Health Screening Unit and to meet Marsha, who handles requests for Lions Regional Programs, Hearing Aid bank, Patient Care Grants and the Lions Health Screening Unit. More than 200 MD 19 Lions and guests had the opportunity to take the tour on Saturday.

Request forms for the 2012 Screening Schedule were mailed to the presidents and secretaries of all Washington & Idaho Clubs. NOW is the time to get them filled out and returned. The deadline is NOVEMBER 30, 2011. Scheduling is done in December so if your request is not received on time you could get left out. A few HINTS—be sure to select 2 or 3 dates that will work for your club. Read the information about what is required of your members when it arrives in your communities. Check with surrounding communities to see if you can get other clubs to request dates before and after yours. Look for local sponsors. Think about whether you would accept a cancellation date if one came up. But most of all. IF YOU WANT IT FILL OUT THE PAPER WORK AND SEND IT IN. If you do not have a form please let me know, I will mail you one immediately. I will have some forms available at the Cabinet Meeting on November 5th. Perhaps your Zone Chair could pick some up.

In November 2010, the budget of \$400,000.00 was adopted for the Northwest Lions Foundation year 2011. As of October, White Cane Days receipts are a little over \$100,000. This means we are \$60,000.00 behind in our estimated income.

No one seems to have the answer to why we are down in donations. Some blame the economy; others are blaming the tension of the past two years between the Multiple District and SightLife/Northwest Lions Foundation. At this point, the one thing we all know is without the White Cane Days donations, we are limited in our ability to help with your requests in a timely manner.

I would ask the Club Presidents to check with the Treasurers to see if your WCD check has been sent to the Foundation. If it has THANK YOU VERY MUCH. If not please do it NOW. If you still have questions CALL ME (509) 966-3927. If you've been undecided send money EVERY DOLLAR GOES TO SUPPORT LIONS REGIONAL PROGRAMS. (Mark Checks WCD 2011)
